Originally Sarah was believed to have a mild traumatic brain injury (TBI), a term which is often used interchangeably with concussion. A mild TBI is commonly thought of as any loss of consciousness that lasts less than 30 minutes, any loss of memory for events immediately before or after an accident, any change of mental state, and any problems with focus. Patients are generally assessed with the Glasgow Coma Scale to measure their level of consciousness after a TBI.
